

## Apricots, Peaches, Nectarines & Pluots 1/2

When choosing a site for your fruit trees, remember to consider a spot with full sun and well drained soils. A slope on or near a body of water is desirable since temperatures do not generally change rapidly. Protect blossoms from early frosts to ensure pollination. Fertilize your fruit trees in March and again in August with Al's Slow Release Fertilizer. Follow our Fruit Tree Spraying Made Easy guide and spray dormant sprays in fall, winter and repeat in spring to control disease problems and insects. Place mason bees and their houses in your orchard or near your trees before your fruit trees bloom to increase fruit production.
