



What: A record number of invasive Japanese Beetles have been detected in Washington County this summer (2016). To date, the Oregon Department of Agriculture has found over 265 Japanese Beetles in traps placed in the area as well as numerous live beetles causing feeding damage on roses and other plants. The evidence suggests a breeding population of the non-native insect has been established. The Japanese Beetle grubs feed on grass roots and can be extremely damaging to lawns. The very voracious adults are omnivorous, feeding on a variety of plant hosts, including roses, ornamentals, trees, shrubs, fruit and vegetables, often devouring the upper sides of plant foliage, leaving only the skeleton of veins and midribs behind.
